Two single-stall and wheelchair-accessible restrooms are just outside the sanctuary in the Commons, and another one is down the hallway across from the gym.


PRELUDE

Forgive us, we pray, and transform our lives. Empower our generosity and help us recognize your surprising power within and around us.



FIRST READING

Isaiah 55:1-11

All of you who are thirsty, come to the water! Whoever has no money, come, buy food and eat! Without money, at no cost, buy wine and milk! Why spend money for what isn't food, and your earnings for what doesn't satisfy?


Listen carefully to me and eat what is good; enjoy the richest of feasts. Listen and come to me; listen, and you will live. I will make an everlasting covenant with you, my faithful loyalty to David. Look, I made David a witness to the peoples, a prince and commander of peoples. Look, you will call a nation you don't know, a nation you don't know will run to you because of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, who has glorified you. Seek the LORD when the LORD can still be found; call out while God is yet near. Let the wicked abandon their ways and the sinful their schemes. Let them return to the LORD so that the LORD may have

mercy on them, to our God, because God is generous with forgiveness.

My plans aren't your plans, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. Just as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my plans than your plans. Just as the rain and the snow come down from the sky and don't return there without watering the earth, making it conceive and yield plants and providing seed to the farmer and food to the eater, so is my word that comes from my mouth; it does not return to me empty. Instead, it does what I want, and accomplishes what I intend.

★ Gospel Reading

John 6:35-40, 44-51

A reading from the Gospel according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. But I told you that you have seen me and still don't believe. Everyone whom Abba God gives to me will come to me, and I won't send away anyone who comes to

me. I have come down from heaven not to do my will, but the will of the one who sent me. This is the will of the one who sent me, that I won't lose anything God has given me, but I will raise it up at the last day. This is my Abba's will: that all who see the Son and believe in the Son will have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day.

"No one can come to me unless they are drawn to me by Abba God who sent me, and I will raise them up at the last day. It is written in the Prophets, 'And they will all be taught by God.' Everyone who has listened to Abba God and learned from God comes to me. No one has seen Abba God except the one who is from God, who has seen God.

"I assure you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate manna in the wilderness and they died. This is the bread that comes down from heaven so that whoever eats from it will never die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."



Give us today our daily bread.




COMMUNION: SHARING THE MEAL

All who hunger, gather gladly! Christ has set the table with grace enough for all. **Amen.**

All are welcome at the Lord's table. If you wish to receive, ushers will invite you forward. The pastor will place a piece of bread or a gluten-free cracker in your cupped hand as you hear "Body of Christ, given for you." In the brass trays are cups of red wine or golden grape juice. Take a small cup as you hear, "Cup of Christ, given for you." You may respond with "Amen," "Thank you," or with quiet acceptance.

If you cannot come forward but wish to receive communion or a blessing, please let an usher know and the servers will come to you. If for any reason you do not wish to receive, you are welcome to come forward for a blessing with your arms crossed over your chest.
