On this day when we celebrate our baptismal calling to serve, let us profess our faith in Christ Jesus: rejecting sin and proclaiming the God who sends us forth!

All of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus from Romans 6 were baptized into his death

that just as Christ was raised from the dead by God's glory, so we also might walk in newness of life. As those who have been brought from death to life, offer yourselves to God as instruments of justice.

Do you renounce evil

and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them. Do you renounce the powers of this world that corrupt and destroy God's creation? I renounce them. Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God's love? I renounce them.

As we profess faith, we use the ancient word "Amen!" to say, "This is true!"

Do you believe God created heaven and earth? Amen! God created all things good and made human beings in God's own image, that we would care for all creation.

Do you believe Jesus Christ is Lord and Savior? Amen! The Lord came not be served but to serve. Our Savior healed the sick, fed the hungry, and identified with outcasts and sinners. Risen from the grave, Jesus gives us courage to confront the forces of death and despair.

Do you believe the Holy Spirit is at work? Amen! The Spirit gives many gifts to the body of Christ, empowers us to love our neighbors as ourselves, and prays within us while we pursue God's will on earth as in heaven. Having made public profession of your faith, do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in baptism: to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ




